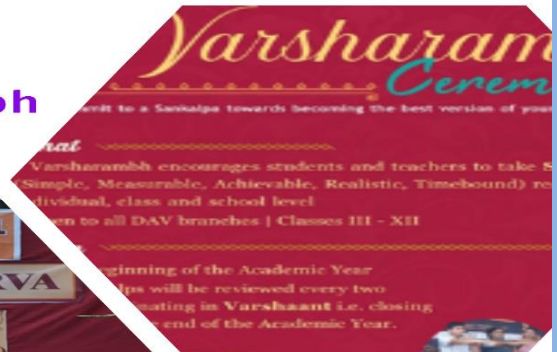

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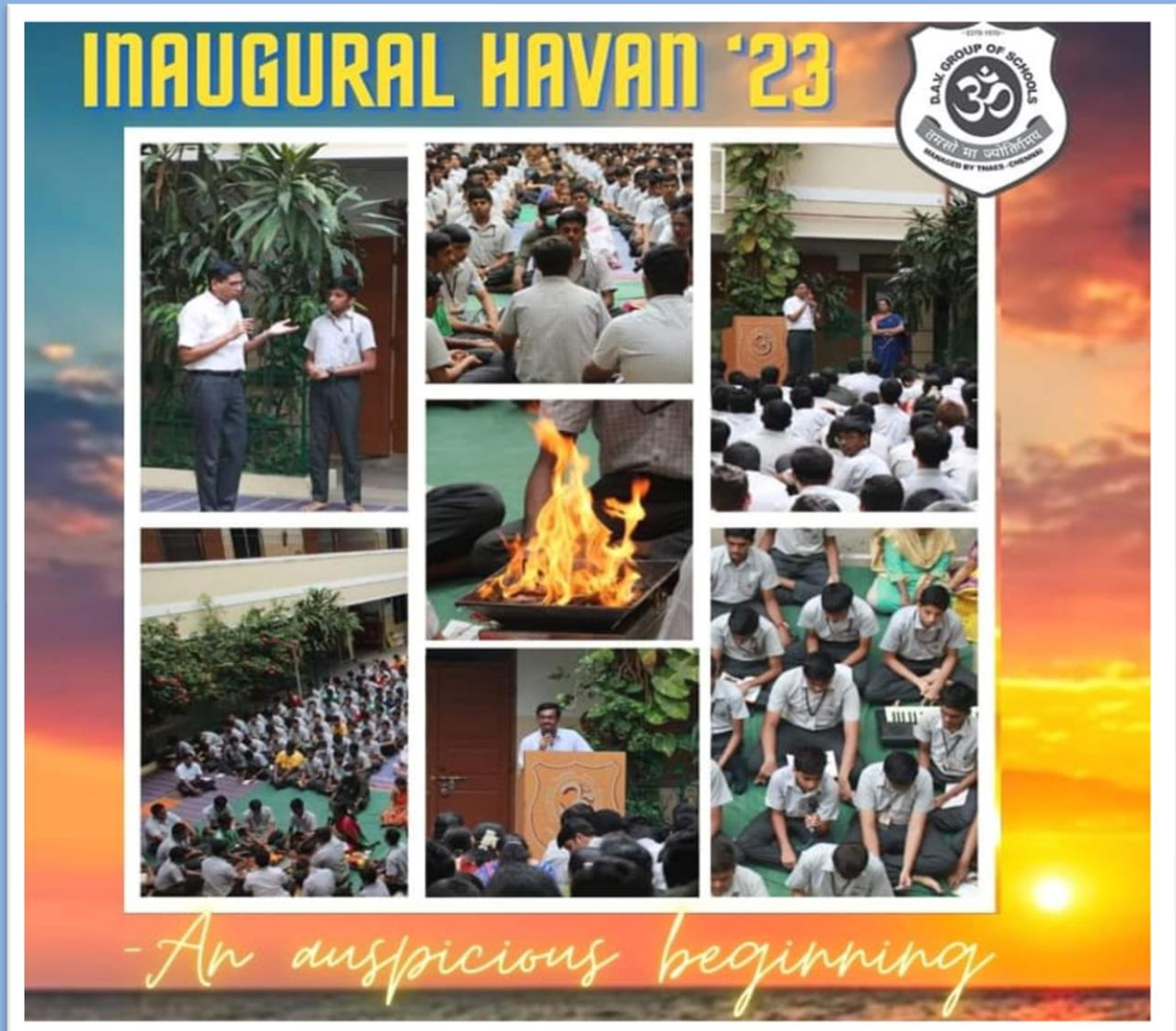

Varsharambh marked the auspicious beginning of the school. It was a solemn occasion which was more like a Sankalp for the entire year.

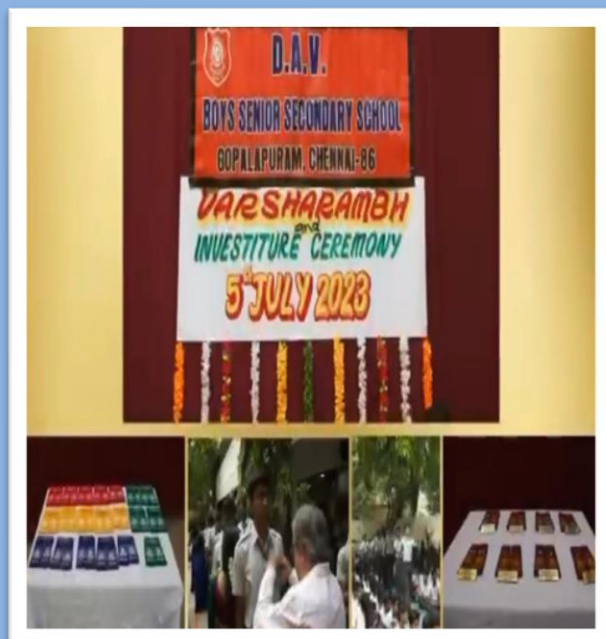
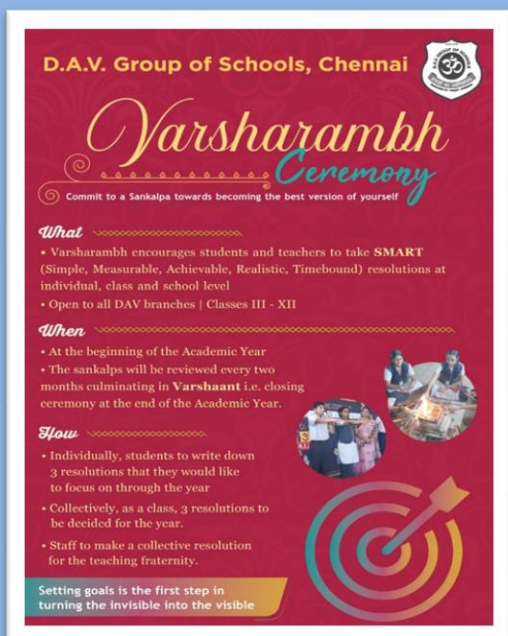

Makers Lab

This lab is setup to enable students to realize the power of thinking, visualizing and to transform their thoughts into a workable process. Students learn to think without constraints and ultimately provide solutions. Solutions are made practical by applying real world constraints arriving at possible outcomes. The most suitable solution is selected and worked upon and finished upon finalization. Either the process or the product is given as activities for the young minds.

In this process the chain is –

Motive -> Thought -> Visualize -> Realize.

Sequence of thought progression at each class level –

Colour -> Size -> Shape -> Form -> Function

The students are trained into 2D drawing, specific 2D drawing, 3D drawing, 3D model making, Model making using - GSM sheets, Cardboard, Wood cutting etc. as of now. Once they learn these basics they would be introduced towards the handling and working with various machines specifically brought in to meet our objectives. The lab consists of various hand tools, power tools and heavy-duty machines.



Some of the heavy-duty machines available in the lab are –

Combined Planer – For cutting, reducing the thickness of wood material both ways.

Chisel Mortiser – For making drills as per the requirement based on the inclination.

Jig Saw machine – For cutting the plywood into various pattern with inclination.

Vertical Band Saw – For cutting the wooden blocks or even the plywood.

Belt Disc Sander – For smoothening the surface of the final product.

Bench Drill Machine – For making drills of varied depth and width.

Lathe Machine – For carving patterns on the wooden blocks.

As a part of classroom activity, students start with the basics of marking, cutting and product making in GSM sheets and cardboard. They come up with various 3D models, puzzles, board games etc., by working individually and as a team. The students contributed their working models for the Daan Utsav 2023-24.

Unveiling of the bust of Swami Dayanand Saraswati

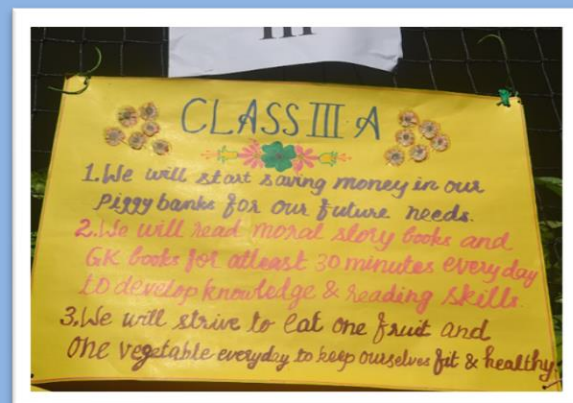

Obtaining Struvite from wastewater

Topic: Science and Technology for Society

Sub topic: Agriculture

CBSE Science exhibition is conducted every year where students from all over India participate.

This exhibition aims to provide a platform for students to demonstrate such learnings that encourage the construction of knowledge by connecting new ideas to existing concepts as well as enriching one's understanding of other's experiences and perspectives.

OUR PROJECT:

Waste management has evolved from satisfying environmental norms to recovering value.

Phosphorus and nitrogen are crucial for agricultural and food production, but phosphorus supply is insufficient. Wastewater sources like landfill leachate, industrial wastewater and agricultural wastewater contributes to eutrophication. To reduce environmental impact, magnesium ammonium phosphate (Struvite) can be recovered from wastewater using a slow-release fertilizer, fostering a circular economy approach. Struvite can partially meet the growing demand for phosphate fertilizers due to the depletion of rock phosphate, increasing fertilizer prices.

OUR EXPERIENCE

Participating in the CBSE science exhibition proved to be a remarkable experience, as it provides us with ample opportunities to explore numerous experiments and innovative ideas presented by other teams. In addition, it allowed us to share our ideas and gain new insights from our fellow participants. Overall, we found the event to be highly informative and enriching, and we look forward to participating in similar events in the future.

3. Surgeon Lieutenant Alfred Marshal (Medical Officer)



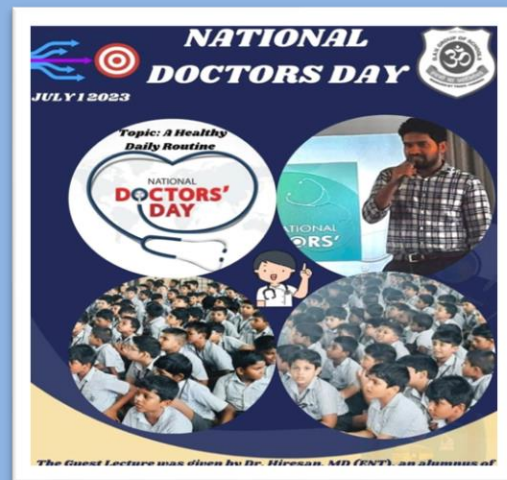
2. Session 2-1st July

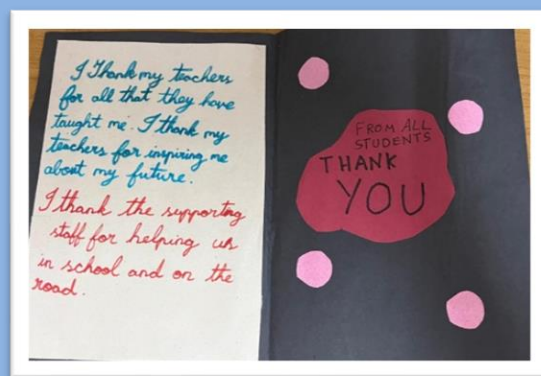

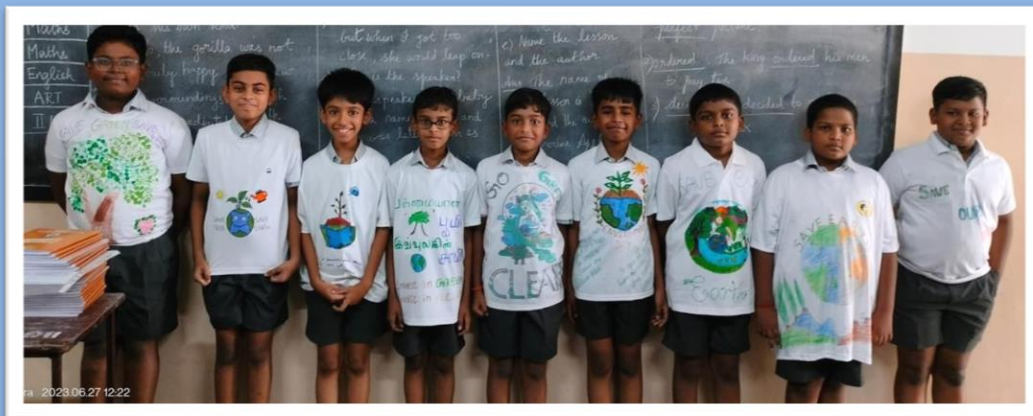

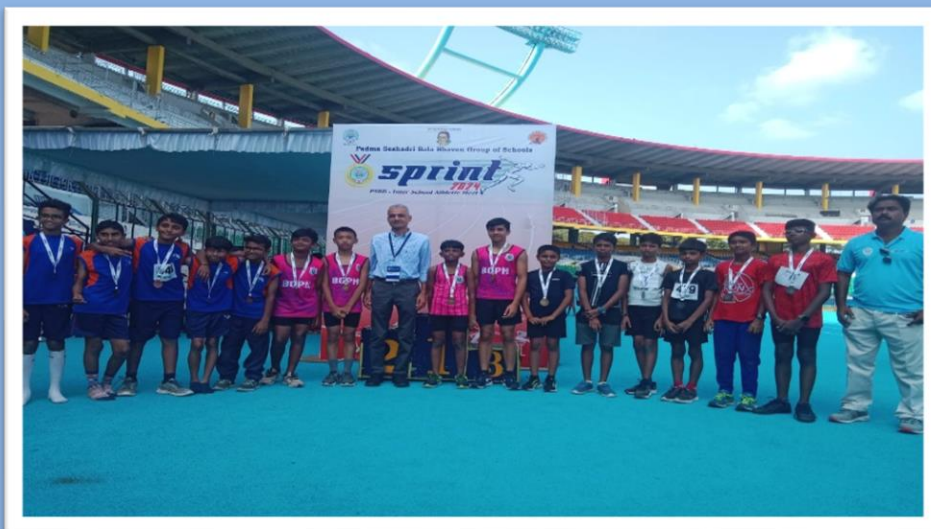

Sunday Satsangs

Arya Samaj Satsangs are now conducted at three locations - Sowcarpet, Pallikaranai and Gopalapuram, attracting over 150 members and non-members every week across locations. Each Satsang typically includes a Hawan, Discourse, Meditation and Shanthipaath, followed by breakfast. Books related to the Vedas, Arya Samaj and related topics are available for sale at the venue. Associate memberships are open to the public and applications are available online.

Outreach Programme

Each month, Arya Samaj identifies an old age home, orphanage, shelter home or residential house/apartment for conducting an outreach program. Samaj members visit these locations to perform Agnihotra, serve lunch and support with small financial donations where required. Twelve outreach programs were conducted this year.
